WORKSHOPS AND PROGRAMS

9:45 AM. "Joseph Ives (1782-1862) & the Looking Glass Clock." In her continuing research Mary Jane Dapkus has developed new information about the looking glass clock. From records of over 100 court cases that were unavailable to Kenneth Roberts when he wrote his excellent book on Ives, it now possible to tell the story of the looking glass clock in greater depth than ever before. When and why was Joseph Ives imprisoned for debt in New York City? Did it have something to do with the looking glass clocks? Did John Birge actually bail him out? Who was Lott Newell, and why was he so angry at Ives and his clock making partners? What was the real reason why these clocks were never very successful? Mary Jane spent two years as curator of the American Clock & Watch Museum, in Bristol, CT. Presently she is the secretary of Ch.148, serves on two NAWCC committees, works as an independent history writer and researcher, and is the contributing editor of the American Clock & Watch Museum's Timepiece Journal.

10:45 AM. "**DIY Yourself Clock Shelf for the Gingerbread Clock."** As noted by chapter member, and newest council member, **David Hagberg**, a period accessory for the ever-popular gingerbread clock was a clock shelf. Good originals are getting hard to find, and reproductions rarely have the proportions and stylistic features of the real thing. He will demonstrate techniques of making convincing reproductions, and will supply patterns of several different shelves for those who would like to try making one. David, a second generation clockmaker, is a wood shop teacher in Westborough Public Schools. A long career in rebuilding fine pianos was good training for his current field of endeavor, and he will share some of his experiences of making new items out of wood to match the old with Chapter 8.

12:45. PM. "Clocks at Winterthur" – Report on a Historic NAWCC Symposium.

The 2016 NAWCC Time Symposium featured more than 20 nationally-renowned experts and curators focused on the 100-plus important clocks and watches at the Winterthur Museum in Wilmington, Delaware. More than 150 participants gathered for 2 1/2 days of lectures and presentations. Bob will describe the special exhibit — "Striking Beauties" — of 16 Winterthur clocks not usually on display. **Bob Frishman**, Chairman of the NAWCC Symposium Committee and organizer of the conference, will summarize for us the new and valuable material seen and heard at one of our country's premier museums of American decorative arts. Bob, a past president of Chapter 8, is a frequent speaker at our meetings, and is author of more than 60 articles published in Watch & Clock Bulletin, Maine Antique Digest, and elsewhere. His "Horology in Art" articles appear in each Bulletin issue, and reflect the theme of the 2017 NAWCC symposium to be held October 26-28 at the Boston Museum of Fine Arts.
